This school, the Sudanese Displaced Learning Centre, started in 1994 and operates on the Sudanese curriculum published by the Sudanese Government. The teaching is in English with Arabic instruction offered. The school has a Christian ethos but the education is tailored to equip the children in a culturally relevant way to be able to return to Sudan which is their home should the opportunity arise in the future.

There are around 200 students in the school from Grades 1 to 11. Without this institution there would be no opportunity for the children of refugees from war torn Sudan to receive an education that will equip them for the future, whether that future is in their adopted country, in their homeland or in another country in the west.

Rebecca Atallah, who came to Egypt with her Egyptian husband over 30 years ago and who has become involved in that time in a whole variety of social ministries, is the key person involved in the running of this school for Sudanese refugees.

Rebecca was the first person to instigate ministries in the now famous main garbage village of Cairo where 60,000 people earn a living by recycling the garbage of the citizens of Cairo. There are between 22-28 million people in Cairo. There is no clear record of numbers but it is a big city!

Rebecca is a true visionary with a real heart for the needy who gives her life to helping the poor as well as supporting her husband who is the General Director of the Egyptian Bible Society and whose ministry stretches well beyond the borders of Egypt.
